

Discourse analysis

The extra task should be about 1000 words for the whole day and about 500 for half. E-mail it to me directly at: malin.ostman@csduppsala.uu.se

Using discourse analysis, and the articles for the seminar + the points below as a *support* (you don't need to follow them precisely), you shall briefly analyze 1 article. You can choose the article your-self, but it must be available online (so I can find it easily).

You shall also briefly discuss why/how/ if discourse analysis as a tool is relevant for Sustainable Development.

What to look for?

- *Hidden relations of power in the text*
- *Who is exercising this power? Whose discourse is being represented?*
- *Who are the spokespeople?*
- *Who is the intended audience?*
- *What is left unspecified or unsaid?*
- *The use of passive voice, or processes expressed as "Things"*
- *The use of for instance colorful, descriptive language*

Questions to ask...

- *Would alternative wording of the same information have resulted in a different discourse being privileged?*
- *HOW are the events being presented?*
- *HOW are the people in the article characterized?*
- *What message does the author INTEND you to get from the article?*
- *Why was this particular picture chose to accompany the article (if there is one).*
- *What kind of repetition exists within the article and within articles of the same topic?*
- *What role do media play? What professional media practices assist with the presentation of dominant discourses (for instance editorial constraints, journalistic standards etc?)*
